St. Thomas University invites applications for instructors to teach the following courses at Sitansisk (St. Mary's First Nation)

Semester 1 (September – December 2025)

**HUM 1003 Introduction of University Studies** (Course offered during the daytime; exact schedule to be determined). The goals of the course are to educate first-year students about the nature and value of liberal arts education; to provide students with a solid foundation in the academic skills necessary for success in university studies; to help students make the transition to university life; and to involve students in the broader university community. (Maximum enrolment: 60)

Semester 2 (January - April 2026)

HUM 1013 Introduction to Humanities (Course offered during the daytime; exact schedule to be determined). This course is designed as a sequel to Humanities 1003, introducing students to university level studies and disciplines. The course aims to enhance the students' abilities to research, think, read and write critically and produce essay-length compositions. Students will study the different types of research methods common to Humanities disciplines, and be able to differentiate between primary and secondary sources as well as qualitative, quantitative and mixed methods of research. Students will also learn and practice various written and oral communication skills and be expected to defend and support their arguments in writing and through presentations. (Maximum enrolment: 60)

St. Thomas University is an undergraduate, liberal arts institution with a full-time enrolment of 1,600. Its students graduate with Bachelor of Arts, Applied Arts, Education, and Social Work degrees. The faculty members are distinguished teachers, researchers and scholars, and the university holds two Canada Research Chairs.

A PhD, or imminent completion is preferred; a Master's degree is required. Each applicant is to submit a curriculum vitae, along with pertinent documentation (ex. teaching portfolio etc.) and arrange to have three letters of reference sent directly to Dr. André Loiselle, Dean of Humanities, St. Thomas University, Fredericton, NB E3B 5G3.
