

1 HOLY CROSS HOUSE

Holy Cross houses 70 residence students. It is also home to faculty offices, the University Chapel, and classrooms.

2 MARGARET NORRIE MCCAIN HALL

McCain Hall is the newest building on campus. In it, you will find classrooms, faculty offices, the Dr. Daniel O'Brien Study Hall, the President's Office, and the Noel Kinsella Auditorium.

3 BRIAN MULRONEY HALL

Named after STU alumnus and 18th Prime Minister of Canada, Brian Mulroney Hall houses classrooms, faculty offices, student study spaces, and the university's Schools of Education and Social Work.

4 GEORGE MARTIN HALL

On the ground level, you will find the Dining Hall, Registrar's Office (including Academic Advising), and Financial Services. The Great Hall is located on the second floor and is a communal space for students, staff, and professors. There is a Java Moose station where you can purchase coffee, snacks, sandwiches, soups, and more. On the third floor, you will find the Student Services Offices. This is where you will go to access Residence Life, the Learning Strategist, the Mental Health Coordinator, the Employment and Financial Aid Coordinator, the Office of Experiential and Community Based Learning.

5 VANIER HALL

Vanier Hall offers residents double and single rooms, as well as shared spaces and a kitchen.

6 HARRINGTON HALL

The recently renovated Harrington Hall offers double and single rooms, shared lounges, washrooms, a kitchen, and communal study spaces.

7 J. B. O'KEEFE FITNESS CENTRE

This fitness centre offers cardio and weight equipment, a multipurpose court and squash court, dressing rooms and shower facilities, and more.

8 SIR JAMES DUNN HALL

On the first floor, you will find open study spaces, the Students' Union Help Desk, the student lounge, the Black Box Theatre, Tim Horton's, and Subway. On the second floor, you will discover more study spaces, the computer lab and ITS Help Desk, and the Wabanaki Student Centre. On the ground level, there are classrooms and lockers. Sir James Dunn Hall also houses Safe Walk/Safe Ride.

9 DONALD C. DUFFIE HALL

Duffie Hall is where you will find the Admissions and Recruitment Offices. This building is affectionately called the Welcome Building.

10 EDMUND CASEY HALL

Edmund Casey Hall houses many faculty offices, classrooms, the Ted Daigle Auditorium, the Anthropology and Psychology labs, and the Writing Centre.
