CONVOCATION

St. Thomas University's Convocation is a gathering of the university community to confer degrees, present awards and medals, and hear the Address to Graduates and Valedictory. Convocation begins with a processional led by graduating students who are followed by faculty, officials, and guests. Each group occupies a designated position and the processional becomes a meeting of the university, the definition of convocation. The Chancellor and the President wear ceremonial St. Thomas University robes designed for their office, while many faculty wear the hoods and gowns of their *alma mater*. The university bestows honorary degrees on individuals who have been deemed deserving of recognition by a Joint Board of Governors-Senate Committee. Wearing green and gold-trimmed robes, St. Thomas University's colours, the recipients receive hoods symbolizing their degrees. Students who have met the university's academic standards are similarly hooded and formally granted all the honours, rights, and privileges pertaining to their degree.

EAGLE FEATHER

Graduating Indigenous students were gifted with Eagle Feathers at a ceremony and are carrying their feather as they receive their degree. In Indigenous communities, there is a sacred connection between the Eagle and the Creator as the Eagle flies highest and closest to the Creator and carries human prayers. In "The Story of the Eagle Feather," the Eagle offered one of its feathers to the human family as a sign of love and healing and a reminder of "Sacred Teachings." An Eagle Feather bestows honour and responsibility as it symbolizes being a messenger for respect, truth, courage, and wisdom as passed down by Elders.

KENTE STOLE

The Black Students' Association has worked with the university to introduce the Kente Stole to commemorate the differences and obstacles Black students overcome in order to graduate. Adapted from African tradition in Ghana, this woven cloth, which was once only worn by royalty, is a scarf-like garment worn over the shoulders that represents an accomplishment, graduation, or other rite of passage. The Kente Stole honours the legacy of Black ancestors and is a testament to each graduate's strength and excellence.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Glenn Cooke is an entrepreneur and philanthropist. He is CEO and co-founder of the Cooke Inc. family of companies which started in Blacks Harbour, NB in 1985. From one aquaculture farm site of 5,000 salmon, it is the now the world's largest private family-owned seafood company, utilizing a fleet of 800 vessels and 30 processing plants in 15 countries, and employing 15,000 people including 3,000 in Atlantic Canada.



Cooke Inc., which has annual revenues of \$4 billion, has consistently been named one of Canada's Best Managed Companies and Atlantic Canada's Top Employers. It has achieved a leading global position providing a sustainable seafood source and has benefitted New Brunswick and Atlantic Canada by providing year-round careers to families and newcomers. Glenn Cooke was recently ranked by IntraFish media as the most influential executive in the global seafood industry.

Cooke has provided significant philanthropic support and contributions to individuals, students, communities, and charitable organizations where his companies operate. His employees are empowered to champion causes in their communities and close to their hearts. The Cooke family and employees annually support hundreds of charitable campaigns, churches, and community organizations, including cancer and diabetes causes, addictions treatment, schools, children's hospitals, after-school programs, services for women, hospice, wellness programs, kids camp bereavement programs, volunteer fire departments, animal shelters, food banks, homeless shelters, and much more. He has personally supported the arts, hospitals, nursing homes, food banks, Canadian veterans, and programming for youth.

Ilkay Silk is a theatre educator and arts mentor. She began teaching at St. Thomas University in 1978, where she played a key role in establishing Theatre St. Thomas and the Black Box Theatre and taught acting courses. She retired from teaching in 2014, having directed more than 100 plays, though still continued to direct at STU as recently as 2024. Her students, either in her courses or mentored in Theatre St. Thomas, graduated with a love of the theatre and an understanding and appreciation of dramatic productions. A remarkable number of her students have gone on to a life in the arts, shaping the landscape of Canadian theatre.



Silk's influence on the arts community in New Brunswick transcends STU's campus. She was a pioneer in the early days of Theatre New Brunswick, was a founding member of the TNB Young Company and Notable Acts Theatre Festival, chaired the NB Arts Board, and produced and directed countless plays in the community. She has chaired both the Theatre New Brunswick and Theatre New Brunswick Foundation Boards. She also adjudicated the New Brunswick Provincial Drama Festival for close to 40 years. She has received the Excellence Award for Arts in Education from the Province of New Brunswick and the inaugural Playhouse Honours Award for her contribution to the performing arts in Fredericton. In 2016, she became a Member of the Order of Canada.

FACULTY AWARDS

JOHN MCKENDY MEMORIAL TEACHING AWARD

Dr. Matt Dinan, Director of the Great Books Program, holds a BA from STU and an MA and PhD from Baylor University, and has taught at STU since 2014. He facilitates the investigation of core human questions in team-taught, discussion-based classes where diverse canonical writers and thinkers are combined with global contemporary texts. His goal is to help students become creative, independent, and self-reflective thinkers, and his courses — on perennial questions about love and friendship, justice and freedom, war and peace, and truth and beauty — empower students to connect core texts with their own questions. He has developed innovative co-curricular programming to foster an intellectual community across the University, including co-founding the first-ever living and learning community at STU. He was also instrumental in developing an experiential learning travel-study course in which students travel with professors to Greece. He has demonstrated his effectiveness as a mentor by helping undergraduates present papers at conferences and publish in peer-reviewed journals. Students he has supervised have been finalists or won prestigious scholarships like the Rhodes Scholarship, McCall-McBain Scholarship, and SSHRC Canada Graduate Scholarships, as well as summer fellowships. He is the only faculty member from Canada selected to join a group of teachers for the Hertog Foundation's online Humanities at Hertog Program.



AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN PART-TIME TEACHING

Dr. Margaret Campbell is a proud graduate of St. Thomas University where her passion for teaching was shaped by professors who modeled compassionate and critical pedagogy. She subsequently earned an MA and PhD from Concordia, and teaches in the Department of Sociology and the Women's Studies and Gender Studies Program. Her teaching practices are informed by critical theories and feminist frameworks, and are grounded in a commitment to building a more equitable, accessible, and socially just world. Campbell is renowned for her steadfast support for students and her dedication to engaging learners in topics often overlooked in the academy. She brings her research into her teaching, particularly in courses that address sensitive subjects like violence, disability, and sexuality. She fosters an atmosphere of care, encouraging students to balance intellectual courage with intellectual humility, to connect academic inquiry with lived experience, and to see themselves as agents of change. Such mentorship involves an investment of time and energy into her students' growth; according to student feedback, she achieves this with excellence.



UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Dr. Michael Dawson holds a BA from the University of British Columbia and an MA and PhD from Queen's University, and has been a faculty member at STU since 2004. He has excelled in his scholarship and has raised the regional and national profile of research at STU. He is nationally recognized as an outstanding scholar of Canadian history and is a member emeritus of the Royal Society of Canada's College of New Scholars, Artists, and Scientists. His research focuses on modern Canadian cultural history and the comparative history of national identity, tourism, consumerism, and sport. He has authored three books, co-edited five others, and published numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals. He has also presented his research at academic conferences throughout Canada and around the world. His publications include *Symbols of Canada* (2018), *Worth Fighting For: Canada's Tradition of War Resistance from 1812 to the War on Terror* (2015), and *The Mountie From Dime Novel to Disney* (1998). These have been called foundational works in Canadian studies, and *Symbols of Canada* became a CBC podcast. He is also a mentor to his students and colleagues across the country, helping them navigate the academy, research, and publishing.
